Summary overview	The QOLI is a brief assessment of 32 items that provides “life satisfaction and outcome with a single score based on 16 areas of life including love, work, and recreation.” Multiple administrations are possible for outcomes measurement; reports that graphically display progress are available. This instrument is appropriate for use with all clinical populations, including mental health and substance abuse.
