

## **Standardized Clinical Presentation**

### **Common Data Points in Assessment Process**

This document serves as a common understanding of clinical presentation. Not all of these elements may be needed on all individuals, rather all should be considered as to whether they impact an admissions decision.

#### **Demographics**

- Age
- Gender
- Insurance
- Contact information (next of kin, health care proxy)
- Guardianship status (including Rogers)
- Legal Status – Sec.12, CV, Sec. 35
- Referral location
- Language
- Disposition -level of care needed

#### **Clinical**

- Current Mental status
- Outpatient providers
- Diagnoses
- Developmental Delay
- History
- Medications
- Pharmacies
- Education
- Formulation/Rationale
- Verbal ability

#### **Violence/Risk assessment**

- Assault risk (recent history & context)
- Homicidal risk
- Psychosis
- Elopement risk
- Legal/forensic issues (upcoming court dates)
- History of fire-setting
- Restraints (related to current presentation)
- History of sexual acting out
- Suicidal risk

#### **Collateral**

- State agency involvement
- Living situation (& ability to return)
- Family & Social History
- Care Management Services

#### **Medical**

- PCP
- Medical risk screening
- Allergies
- Vital signs
- Labs (including pregnancy)
- Toxic Screen
- Blood Alcohol Level
- Substance abuse, recent and past
- Withdrawal Risk
- ADLs
- C-PAP machine
- Oxygen
- Fall risk
- Contact precautions (MRSA, VRE, TB, etc.)
- Physical disability
